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Successful Renewal of CDI

- Program renewed for 4 years at \$19.1 million
- Two national co-op organizations CCA and CCCM will co-manage some \$16.128 million
- The Co-operatives Secretariat will manage \$800,000 for a Research and Knowledge Development Program
- Importance is that the program was renewed in difficult times
- Sector management

OLD CDI

- 2003-2008 First CDI and then renewed for one year until 2009
- Partnership between Co-operatives Secretariat
- \$15 million over 5 years
- Two sections:

Advisory Services

- \$1 million per year administered by the national organizations
- 15 provincial associations
- 6 co-op federations of which 5 in Quebec
- 1 Arctic Co-operatives Limited based in Winnipeg

Innovation and Research

- \$2 million per year
- Funding of projects chosen by a steering committee of co-op reps and others all appointed by government
- Administered by the Co-operatives Secretariat

Ag CDI

- Agricultural Co-operative Development was \$4.25 million over 3 years started in 2006 ended in March 2009
- Helped valued added agricultural and bio-fuel co-ops
- Administered by the 2 national organizations

Results of combined CDI

- I & R some 205 Projects helped
- Over 200 new co-ops created
- Over 1500 co-ops and co-op projects helped
- Two major agricultural co-op conferences
- Production of three major research studies
- CIP, Bio-fuels, Agricultural Co-op Networks

CDI part of Agricultural Policy Framework

- AG Policy Framework renewed for one year 2008-09
- Growing Forward is the federal provincial agricultural partnership part joint programs; part federal only programs
- CDI is in the Agriculture framework because all non-financial co-operative policy at the federal level and the Co-operatives Secretariat are under the Agriculture and Agri-food Department for historic reasons
