### **President's Report**

One of the features that has always distinguished CASC from other professional associations in Canada is its close ties to practitioners. A number of notable developments in the coop world recently are providing interesting opportunities for CASC to engage with the broader sector.

One such development is the formation on the new, bilingual, national apex body, Co-operatives and Mutuals Canada (CMC), which formally came into existence on April 1st, 2014. The new CMC continues the work of the former Canadian Cooperative Association (CCA) and le Conseil canadien de la coopération et de la mutualité (CCCM). While the CMC is new, we are delighted that a familiar face, Denyse Guy (formally, the executive director of the CCA and a long time supporter of CASC), has been appointed the new executive director of CMC. The creation of a new bilingual national body provides a healthy spur to CASC to continue and deepen its efforts to function as a bilingual, national body as well.

As most of you know, as part of its Guidelines for a Cooperative Decade, the ICA has been developing guidance notes for the 1995 Co-operative Principles. As part of this process, the Principles Committee is soliciting comments on the draft guidance notes that have been produced. Again, this provides CASC with another opportunity to engage with the sector by providing a collective reflection on the draft notes. Thanks to Marcelo Vieta for spearheading our response.

Another major co-operative event in which CASC members are involved is the 2014 Summit scheduled for October in Quebec City. CASC members have been actively involved in planning a number of the pre-Summit events – on teaching (Sonja Novkovic, Karen Miner, Claude-Andre Guillotte, among others), research (Lou Hammond Ketilson), and campus coops. In addition, Lou (with support of a strong team) has been organizing the editing of a collection of articles that will be launched at the Summit.

This year, at Brock University in St. Catharines, we are formalizing this cooperation in a new way by working with the Ontario Co-operative Association to plan a whole day on research and teaching events that are particularly focused on practitioners – including student practitioners! – as well as other students who may be interested in learning more about cooperatives. Appropriately, our keynote address will be delivered by Daniel Côté from l'École des Hautes Études Commerciales (HEC), Montréal, who has a long history of engaging with practitioners, including in action research projects. Thanks to Mark Ventry and his team at ON-COOP for collaborating with us on this mini-extravaganza (which will include a special tribute to Ian MacPherson at our annual joint banquet with ANSER). I look forward to seeing you in St. Catharines!

### **CASC 2014: Co-operating across Borders: Expanding** the Boundaries of the Social and Solidarity Economy

CASC 2014 conference is just around the corner. This year we are converging on Brock University in St. Catharine's, Ontario, from May 26 to May 29th. The conference theme for the Congress this year is *Borders without Boundaries* and we at CASC have embraced that theme. Researchers and practitioners have responded well to our call for papers and our conference programme is shaping up to have good representation from across the country.

Our keynote speaker this year will be Dr. Daniel Côté from HEC Montréal. We have two joint sessions with each. The connections to our sister organization, ANSER (Association for Nonprofit and Social Economy Research) also continue. We will have a number of joint sessions, receptions, and of course the banquet with their members.

We will also be celebrating the life and scholarship of our dear friend, mentor, and co-op activist, Ian MacPherson. One of the topics close to Ian's heart was co-operatives and peace. We will have a panel that discusses not only the role of co-operatives in peace building, but also a discussion about Ian's thoughts on this topic. We will also be honouring him at the banquet with our ANSER colleagues. If you have pictures or memories you would like to share, please contact Erin (erin.hancock@coopscanada.coop) as she is helping to put together a slide show and memory book.

### CASC 2014 Keynote speaker

#### Daniel Côté



Daniel Côté is an associate professor at l'École des Hautes Études Commerciales (HEC), Montréal, where he has taught since 1983. He obtained his PhD from Louisiana

State University in 1985. At HEC, he was involved with le Centre de Gestion des Coopératives from 1977 and 2003 and was its director from 1992 to 2003. He teaches courses on business strategy at the graduate and undergraduate levels. He has taught a graduate course on co-operative management for the Master of Management: Co-operatives and Credit Unions program at St-Mary's University (Canada).

Professor Côté has conducted research on cooperatives for more than 25 years. His approach to research is very much action based where fundamental ideas and concepts (such as loyalty) are being implemented and tested in real life context with existing co-operatives.

He has published extensively on different co-operative sectors (mostly agribusiness and finance) and on issues such as management, strategy and entrepreneurship. His main concern has always been the management of co-operatives in a competitive environment. His work focuses on the development of a new co-operative paradigm. He develops the idea that co-operative leaders have an incentive to strengthen their co-operative identity since it is a source of competitive advantage. His new co-operative paradigm is based on issues of loyalty, mobilization through values, learning organization, meaning and legitimacy.

He regularly gives conferences on co-operatives both in Canada and internationally. In 2004, he received the ACE (Association of Co-operative Educators) award for Outstanding Contribution to Cooperative Education and Training. He was selected as fellow of the Filene Institute in October 2011.

#### **News from Centre for Co-operative and Community-Based Economy, University of Victoria**

Dr. Ana María Peredo, Director of the Centre for Co-operative and Community-Based Economy was recently invited to visit the Seikatsu Club Workers Collectives and The Civil Policy **Research Institute** in Tokyo, Japan.

The Seikatsu Club Workers Collectives began in 1965 when a single Tokyo housewife organized 200 women to buy reasonably priced, higher quality milk for their families. The co-operative has developed into a formidable commercial enterprise serving over 230,000 households. The co-op emphasizes direct producer/consumer links to moderate and humanize the market.

For the past 10 years the CCCBE has partnered with this incredible community social enterprise. Ana María states that "there are many things we can learn from this group of collectives and the creative women who have developed social enterprises to meet the food, health, environmental, educational, child care and elder care needs of their families, and continue growing these collectives by making a difference at a political level. This is a world renowned model that serves as an outstanding example of a sustainable social enterprise."

As an international leader on co-operatives and the community-based economy, Ana María Peredo was invited to present "On Essays on Polanyi on Market Economies" Social Enterprise Network at the Civil Policy Research Institute in Tokyo, Japan. In addition, she also presented a tribute to the work done by the late Dr. Ian MacPherson on the Co-operative Movement.

#### UVIC Student winner of the CCCBE's Ian MacPherson Scholarship shapes art into research

Congratulations to Bruno de Oliveira Jayme for being awarded the 2014 Dr. Ian MacPherson Scholarship! Bruno is a UVic PhD student in Interdisciplinary Studies combining arts, education and human geography to challenge the status quo of waste management in Latin America through artistic processes.

For the past four years Jayme has worked in partnership with the recycling cooperatives in Brazil to host workshops and create a mobile art exhibit, titled "Collector of stories" to display the artwork made out of recyclable materials, produced by homeless people from the Sao Paulo region. The mobile art exhibit is helping oppressed individuals to find their own voice to fight for social justice and as income generation for those who make the streets of Sao Paulo their home. Bruno is using this fieldwork to help advance social inclusion and to develop pedagogical materials on the use of art techniques as a research tool.

The Dr. Ian MacPherson Scholarships are awarded to outstanding graduate students at the University of Victoria with an interest in co-operative studies and community based economy.

He is the co-author of a number of books and reports and has written numerous articles and papers on industrial organization, co-operatives, and agricultural policy. Murray has worked on research projects for the Economic Council of Canada and has served as a consultant to the Saskatchewan government and the Federal/Provincial Task Force on the Role of Co-operatives and

Government in Community Development. Most recently, he was part of a team of faculty from the university to be awarded \$1M from Federated Co-operatives Limited to explore co-operative business development in rural and Aboriginal communities.

We thank **Lou Hammond Ketilson** for her vital contribution to the ongoing success of the Centre during her more than nine years as director, and are pleased that she will continue her involvement with the Centre as a Fellow in Co-operative Management. Lou has continuing responsibilities as the lead of two large research projects: a 2010–15 initiative on the impact of cooperatives and credit unions in Canada funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, and a 2013–16 project on sustainable rural development in Africa funded by the International Development Research Centre. Both are in partnership with the Canadian Cooperative Association.

### **Call for Conference Papers**

We are pleased to announce that a new research area, "Co-operative economy and collective ownership", will be permanently part of the EAEPE conferences.

This research area welcomes scholars interested in the co-operative sector, an important component of the economy in Europe, in the Americas and in the Asia Pacific, and of developing significance in Africa. The co-operative firm is a very old institution, as is the interest that economics, sociology, history and management have shown in its study. Nevertheless, the attention given to the co-operative economy, in both research and teaching, is limited, if compared to its actual dimension and potential, especially in times of crisis.

This research area is interested in all forms of co-operative businesses: workers' cooperatives; consumer cooperatives; credit unions and banks; users' co-operatives; mutuals and insurances. We are also interested in community-level forms of collective ownership of services and public goods. Co-operatives operate in the most diverse industries, markets and societies. An interdisciplinary research approach is most welcome given the multi-faceted nature of the co-operative movement, whose symbolic birth is held to be in Manchester in 1844, though much older and more primitive forms of co-operatives have existed in Europe (back to the Roman period), Asia (during early Chinese dynasties) and in the Americas (in Pre-Columbian societies).

Some of the recent interest in co-operation has been prompted by the financial crisis and the debate on the failures of capitalism. But even in growth periods, the co-operative model has been praised as an option for very contemporary needs such as workers' participation and involvement, ownership of standards and systems in the digital economy and in creative industries, alternative currencies and peer to peer banking, and self management of community level services and facilities.

Next conference, as you may already know, will be held at University of Cyprus, Nicosia, Cyprus from 6-8 November 2014.




